## MUCH DECIDUOUS FRUIT IS SHIPPED

The California Fruit Distributors, under date of September 10, say: The following gives number of cars of deciduous fruit shipped from all points in California for the week (seven days) ending Friday morning, September 9:

Peaches, 154 cars—Shipment of this week shows a marked falling off from the preceding week and the difference will be even greater in the seven days to follow. Salways are now practically done and there is not a great deal of stock available outside of Levi Clings, which can be furnished in such quantities as desired. These peaches have been very largely purchased by the canners at satisfactory prices, but it will be possible for us to fill such orders as may be required.

Pears, 52 cars—Shipment of this variety shows a further falling off and as in the case with peaches this will be even more noticeable during the coming week. The crop is now practically shipped.

Grapes, 301 cars—Grape shipments consist almost entirely of Tokays, although there are a few Malagas moving in carlots and small shipments of other varieties such as Black Morocco and Cornicheon are now going forward in assorted cars. The grape movement has been a little less than was expected this week, and from present appearances will remain at about the same figure for the week to follow. Stock is universally admitted to be much finer than usual.

Weather conditions remain exceedingly favorable. With warm days and cool nights the coloring of the fruit is going on rapidly and these conditions are also favorable to the full and perfect development of the fruit.
