## HIGH PRICES FOR BARTLETTS

Buyers Fight for Possession at Fancy Prices—First Car of Comice Brings \$2.73 Per Half Box—Only Six Cars of California Comice.

Sgobel & Day, under date of New York, September 6, say: Pears—Few Bartletts from California in the sale today and fought for from \$3 to \$3.75 per box. One small line of beauties sold at \$4. We sold the first car of Comice of the season, A Block brand, California, making an average of \$2.73 per half box—handsome, of course, but a little too early and weather today roasting hot. There will only be about six cars of these altogether, and they will be out of the way within two weeks.

Plums—Seven cars sold today, making averages as follows: Walla Walla, Sgobel & Day, \$1.27; Walla Walla, Sgobel & Day, \$1.29; Milton, Sgobel & Day, \$1.25; Payette, another receiver, \$1.10; Payette, \$1.14; Yakima, \$1.09; The Dalles, \$1.12.

Generally these plums were in sound condition, but six cars today with a possibility of as many more tomorrow, caused the market to droop a bit. However, they were taken very lively. In fact, we must say that all the fruit sold today did well as we expected after the three days with no sales, and therefore an almost bare market. The future prices on Italian plums depends entirely on the quantities to be offered. Oregon and Washington are nearly through, but Idaho is making its appearance, and if the western markets go off they will naturally send them on here. However, if they come sound we see no reason why they should not command satisfactory prices.

Peaches—You see nearly 13 cars in the sale today. We had the only car from Colorado, which made 89 cents on the extras and 65 cents on the fancy, while there were four from Utah which sold from 60 to 90 cents and the bulk about 70 cents, and two from Washington that sold 60 to 70 cents. Those from California did badly.

### ROBBERS GET \$57,000; POLICE HAVE NO CLUE

SEATTLE, Wash., Sept. 12.—Government secret service agents who are working on the case involving the theft of \$57,000 in gold, weighing more than 250 pounds, from the steamer Humboldt have no clue whatever to the perpetrators of this extraordinary theft. The gold was part of a shipment of \$170,000 brought here from Fairbanks, Alaska, and for delivery to the local assay office. When the gold was transferred from the steamer Humboldt to the assay office it was found that one of the boxes had been opened and the contents, \$57,000 in gold dust, had been taken. Chunks of pig lead had been placed in the box. The shipment was handled by the Alaska-Pacific Express company, which is held responsible for the loss. The shipment was insured, however, through the Fireman's Fund Insurance company of San Francisco.
