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District Fair Promises Much

Grants Pass Is Making Great Preparations for Fair to Show Off Superiority of Southern Oregon Products.

GRANTS PASS, Sept. 17.—The fourth annual district fair, to be held at Grants Pass, October 5, 6 and 7, promises to be a success in every particular. The board of managers state that the interest being taken by all sections of Josephine county and portions of Jackson county surpasses any previous year since the Rogue River industrial fair was inaugurated by the people of Grants Pass.

The stock and poultry exhibits bid fair to excel in point of numbers as well as breed, this being particularly true of the horses, colts and Jersey cattle. Animals are coming from the extreme ends of the two counties and much rivalry exists among the numerous breeders of fine stock.

The committees having in hand the general arrangements report that everything will be in readiness by the opening day and that apart from the exhibits much in the way of instructive demonstrations will be in evidence along such lines as pumping by gasoline engine, spraying, incubation, electrical washing and wringing devices; in the culinary department, cooking, preserving, candy making, etc.

The carnival features will be very attractive and some very laughable stunts have been prepared, affording amusement for the old as well as the young.

The parade of livestock each day will be one of the attractive features of the fair, and in addition there will be equestrian parades and drills by ladies in elegant costumes mounted upon fine saddle horses.

The Ashland Commercial club and the Fruit and Produce association of that city are making elaborate preparations for the fair and have applied for special transportation for several hundred Ashland citizens, exhibitors and visitors. The Ashland spirit is very commendable and the people here will not be slow to appreciate it.

A large per cent of the business men of Grants Pass are offering special premiums in the various divisions, and in addition they will occupy numerous booths fitted up as exhibits of their wares, while others intend to provide rest rooms.

The ladies of the auxiliary will occupy the new Claus Schmidt building for the fine arts and textile departments, and will also serve lunch every day at their headquarters at the Commercial club. Private houses will be requisitioned for rooms to help accommodate the visitors, as the hotels, under ordinary circumstances are usually overcrowded.

From this time on the fair will be the leading subject in the minds of the people and the newcomer will behold some of the realities of which he has heretofore only heard or read about.
