

PRICES ADVANCE ON GOTHAM MARKET

NEW YORK, Sept. 17.—Prices advanced slightly at the opening of the stock market today, New York Central scoring a rise of 1 1/4. Union Pacific, Baltimore & Ohio and Evansville & Terre Haute all joined in the advance. Later the upward movement was checked and selling orders brought declines that took Union Pacific back to yesterday's close. Towards the close the market was firmer and advances appeared again, Wabash preferred, Consolidated Gas and Tennessee Copper gaining 1. The general list showed strength, but late declines again appeared, American Car preferred dropping 2 1/2. The market closed dull.
