

# 35 KILLED IN TRAIN WRECK

FORT WAYNE, Ind., Sept. 21.—Thirty-five persons were killed in a head-on collision between two Wabash valley traction cars this afternoon near Kingsland and 20 were injured.

The Wabash Valley road is an electric interurban line operating between Fort Wayne and Logansport, Ind. The accident occurred near Kingsland, in Wells county, south of here. The two cars that crashed were specials.

The cars were running at a high rate of speed when the crash came, according to reports of the accident received here. They met with terrific force and one of them was practically demolished.

Mock has been working as a carpenter this summer in Medford. Last fall he chopped wood for Arthur Rose on Griffin creek. The man has borne an evil reputation since he has been in this district, but has not caused any trouble. He was in the habit of hinting mysteriously of crimes hitherto performed.

Jesse Smith, the murdered man, had served in the Seventh United States cavalry for a number of years. He had seen active service in the Philippines and during the Boxer uprising in China, as five bullet scars and one hole cut on his body testified. For four years Smith was a Texas ranger. He was 35 years old and unmarried.

An Eye Witness' Story.  
The tragedy is described by David Martin, one of the two eyewitnesses, as follows:

"Mock and Jesse went hunting together on Labor day up Griffin creek. Jesse got tired as they found no game and returned home. Mock's dog followed him. Jesse tied the dog up, fed and took care of it. On Monday Mrs. Mock came after the dog. Jesse is said to have jokingly said: 'I haven't your dog.' She thought that he was lying to her and became angry. Finally Smith gave her the dog.

"The next evening McMullen, Jesse and I were sitting around the table waiting for J. H. Free to come over from his home across the street to make up a four-handed game of cards. I was reading while the others were talking together, when there was a knock on the door. McMullen asked the knocker to enter. Mock came in the door looking somewhat

flushed. I think he had been drinking. He shook hands with me and Jesse introduced him to McMullen. Then Mock asked Jesse: 'Why did you try and steal my dog?'

The Lie Passed.  
"I didn't; I was just fooling with your woman; I did not intend to keep the dog," Smith answered.

"Why did you call my wife a liar?" Mock said next.

"I didn't call her a liar," Jesse responded. Then he was passed and they were fighting. I do not know which one hit first. Martin and I were going to let them fight it out, not knowing that Mock had a knife in his hand. There were two lamps on the table and I grabbed them, as they were in danger of being tipped over.

"He Has Killed Me."  
Suddenly Jesse cried: 'Take him off. He has stuck me with a knife.' McMullen grabbed Mock's wrist, but it was too late. Jesse said quietly: 'He has killed me,' and fell face downward on the floor. I asked McMullen to go and telephone for a doctor. I ran outside to see if there was any help in sight, and at the door met Mrs. Mock, who said: 'Jesse hit first, and don't you lie about it.' I returned to Jesse and tried to get response from him, but he could not talk. After a minute or two the struggling ceased and I knew that the man was dead.

"I believe that the murder was premeditated and that Mock came with an open knife in his pocket with the intention of doing damage to Smith."

Mrs. Mock is being held by the officers, as it is believed that she is an accomplice.  
Coroner Kellogg is holding an inquest this afternoon.
