### OAKLAWN PEARS BRING \$3.86 AVERAGE PER CAR

In a recent issue you stated that the price received for D'Anjou pears from Oaklawn orchard this year was \$5.45 a box. This was likely to convey the impression that the entire car averaged this figure, instead of its being the top price. This price was just one cent less per box than an entire car grossed last year, but the average for the car, manifest for which has just been received, is \$3.86 per box, which, considering the quality, due to unfavorable weather, I regard as an exceptionally good price.

Peach shipments on the wane in this vicinity.

(Tidings.) The Salway peach still lingers in this market, almost solitary and alone as representative of its species. The Ashland Fruit and Produce Association plans to ship two cars this week, virtually all Salways, which will about clean up its shipments in the peach line for the season. Being the last of their kind, they generally command a pretty good price, as they serve as a reminder of the waning of all things peachy.

Apples come next, and these in a general way will be shipped under the auspices of the Rogue River Valley Fruit association, though the actual handling here will be done through the local organization, a fact which patrons should bear in mind. This is an act of co-operation which has been entered into for the best interests of all concerned.
