## COMICE PEARS IN PORTLAND MARKET

Comice pears—the fruit that made Rogue River famous as the best pear producing section of the United States, have made their appearance in the local market for the first time this season.

Some supplies of this variety have come forward from Hood River and were in excellent condition. While no sales were reported along the street this morning, the fruit was quoted firm at \$2.25 a box.

The pear market in general was quoted with considerable strength along Front street today. Receipts are moderate and supplies are just about equal to demand at prevailing figures.
