Some D'Anjou pears, the first of the season to enter the local trade, appeared from the Dufur country. They were shipped by the Dufur Valley Fruit Growers' association and were quoted firm at \$2 a box along 35c. the street this morning.

The pear market in general was quoted with considerable strength chickens, 14@16e; turkeys, 17c. along Front street today. Receipts are moderate and supplies are just about equal to demand at prevailing grass, \$14; grain hay, \$16.
