## TWO MEN DIE IN WINE VAT

SACRAMENTO, Cal., Sept. 28.—Phillip Kijiliss and Marcello Pasoncelli are at the Sisters' hospital in a dying condition today, having been overcome by gas fumes in a 5000-barrel wine vat at the Sacramento Valley Winery company this morning.

Pasoncelli entered without first airing the tank. He was overcome with carbonic acid and sulphuric acid gas fumes. Kijiliss rushed to the aid of his companion. He also was overcome by the fumes. Before losing consciousness Kijiliss frantically called for help.

Fellow workmen rushed to their aid, but dared not enter the tank because of the fumes. An attempt to raise the unconscious man from the death trap by ropes failed. Every available man was put to work cutting a hole in the vat. The men who rushed into the vat after the hole was cut were nearly overcome by the deadly fumes. The unconscious workmen were rushed to the hospital where doctors worked over them for hours but were unable to restore them to consciousness.

If the men survive, the gases may have a permanent effect on the brains of both, according to the physicians.
