## FALL APPLES IN LOCAL MARKET

Fall apples are making their appearance in the local markets. For the last week or more Jonathans have been offered and the first boxes of Spitzberg apples were brought into the markets Tuesday.

The apples are not of the quality that has made the Rogue River valley famous, for the best are being shipped to eastern markets. In fact, much complaint in this regard is heard from visitors and residents who desire to procure a few fancy boxes to send to their friends.

The apples, although small, which are offered locally, have the same delicious flavor as the best that are shipped.

The farmers are being paid 2 cents a pound and the grocers are receiving 3 cents a pound for them.

**SAYS BUYERS ARE CAUTIOUS.**

N. G. Gibson, Chicago, Reports Few Sales of Western Box Apples.

CHICAGO, Sept. 28.—This week when asked for an opinion regarding the apple situation, N. G. Gibson, head of the Gibson Fruit company, said:

"There is nothing really important to say about the general apple deal either in the east or the west. Most buyers are moving cautiously and are showing more care to get full value for their money than we have sometimes observed at this time of the year.

"We are getting quite a little correspondence regarding northwestern box apples, but sales are scattering. The general impression seems to be that prices are rather out of line.

"So far little or no fancy winter stock is being offered, but will be in the course of a few days. From the present lay of the land it would seem that either growers' ideas will have to come down or else dealers' ideas will have to go up. In other words, there will have to be a compromise somewhere, for the two factions are too far apart now to do much business. We are merely sales agents and so far as we are concerned it doesn't make any difference to us what becomes of prices, but we should like to see things lined up in a little better shape so there would be more hope for a free movement when the time comes.

"Most western growers are asking prices about as follows: Fancy Jonathans, \$1.50 to \$1.60; choice, \$1.25 to \$1.35; Genos, 1.10 to 1.15. For Ben Davis and similar varieties to be shipped soon they are asking \$1.25 to \$1.75; for Spitzbergs \$1.75 to \$2.25, and for Rome Beauties \$1.25 to \$1.50."

**COLORADO FRUIT MOVING.**

Apple Shipping Begins From Western Slope Stations.

GRAND JUNCTION, Col., Sept. 28.—Grand Junction is now beginning to ship fruit in earnest and within a few days will take a lead in the valley on both apples and pears. From 20 to 30 cars per week are going out from this city now.

Clifton is shipping two to three cars daily of cantaloupes, with an occasional car of peaches, pears and apples. Shipments of apples are increasing from that point as well. Palcaedes is also sending out four to five cars a day, consisting of apples, pears

and peaches. The late peaches are beginning to come in, and most of the fruit shipments are made up of Railways from that point.
