PENDLETON HAS WILD WEST DAY

Hundreds of Visitors Attending "The Round Up" in Eastern Oregon—Over 500 Cowboys and Cowgirls Participate.

PENDLETON, Or., Sept. 29.—With hundreds of visitors from various parts of the Pacific coast present, Pendleton's Wild West Show, "The Roundup," began today. For the next three days there will be horse racing, broncho roping, branding and tying, shooting contests and other exhibitions of cowboy life. It is proposed to make the show an annual affair. It is being conducted along the same lines as that held in Cheyenne annually.

Indians will play a prominent part in the sports and over 500 cowboys and cowgirls will participate.

Cowboys from the surrounding country are pouring into the city, bent on capturing some of the many prizes that are offering. A squad of cowboys from Idaho, Montana and Nevada reached here last night.

Practically every outlaw horse in eastern Oregon has been rounded up for use in the bucking contests.
