ORDINANCE NO. 381.

An ordinance declaring the cost of the improvement of North Holly from Main street to Second street and assessing the property benefited thereby, and declaring such assessment, and directing the entry thereof in the docket of city liens.

The city of Medford doth ordain as follows: Section 1. That no protests having been filed against the improvement of North Holly, due notice of the intention of the council to cause said improvement to be made having been given, and said improvement having been ordered made, the council has considered the matter and herewith ascertains the probable cost of making such improvement to be the sum of \$.....
