JAY BOWERMAN, assembly candidate for governor, is the coarsest product of Machiavelism that Oregon politics has yet produced. He is on any side of any question-to get the votes.

He was nominated by an assembly of politicians and corporation employes, held in defiance of the primary law, whose proclaimed motive was to put the knife to Statement No. 1.
