BLAKELEY BRINGS SUIT VS. KENDALLS

PORTLAND, Or, Oct. 6. Charing bad faith on the part of J. L. and S. A. Kendall of Pennsylvania in the purchase of holdings of the Oregon Boom & Timber company and in the acquirement of timber lands in Douglas county, Fred J. Blakeley of Roseburg yesterday brought two suits in the United States court and asked that he be awarded judgments cwt. aggregating \$10,861, as well as other relief.

Blakeley advises the court that the Pennsylvanians agreed to purchase a majority of the stock of the Oregon Boom & Timber company for \$8000, the plaintiff being at that time the owner of all the stock with the exception of a few shares. After delivering four-fifths of the entire capitalization, Blakeley alleges that the Kendalls assumed possession of the property without paying for the stock, and he also charges that they have not only made use of the property, but have removed part of the equipment. It is further charged that the Kendalls have failed to build a mili at Winchester as provided in their contract, and have failed to incorporate a company to clear out the grass, \$14; grain hay, \$16. obstructions in the Umpqua river so as to make the stream desirable for driving logs.

In the second case Mr. Blakeleycharges that in 1907 he was employed by the Kendalls to purchase destrable timber lands for them, and that they agreed to make a suitable remuneration for such service. After purchasing a number of claims, at a cost of \$25,000, Blakeley thinks he should have a commission of \$2861, but the defendants refuse to liqui-

ROSEBURG, Or., Oct. 6.-The 'wet' element of Roseburg is jubilant over the result of the city election. when five of the six "wet" candidates were elected members of the city council over the so-called "dry' champions by majorities ranging from 15 to 50 votes.

Eddy, on a street corner in the business district last evening, the strife of the election centered in the Fourth ward, where Walter Hamilton, a lo eal druggist, who was supported almost to a man by the "dry" voters, was defeated by Dr. A. F. Sether by majority of 15 votes

Local politicians affiliated with the "wet" faction attribute Hamiton's defeat to Eddy's address and declare that they would have supported him had it not been for the charges of fraud preferred against the stockholders of the Roseburg Brewing & Ice Co., by Mr. Eddy.
