RAILROAD IS NEARING FALLS

Pacific and Eastern Has Steel Laid Laid to a Point Within 4 1-2 Miles of Timber City—Will be There By November 1 Unless Rain Interferes.

The Pacific & Eastern railroad is now within four and one-half miles of Butte Falls the timber city of southern Oregon, and unless rains prevent steel will be laid the extra distance by November 1.

Work on the construction of bridges has delayed the steel laying gangs and, although the work was rushed, it was rather slow. But during the winter, when the wagon roads are almost impassable, the railroad will be in operation.
