

CAR FROM HILLCREST IS SOLD FOR \$1700

Sgobel and Day of New York, under date of October 5, say:

Pears—We sold three cars today, one D'Anjous from North Yakima, \$3.75 to \$5 1-8 with an average of \$4.50 per box, and some fall Butter pears selling at \$2.80 per box, gross of the car \$1,884. Then we sold a car Block, California, half boxes winter Nellis averaged \$2.50, Easter Beurre, \$1.70 and Giant Morocco, \$1.60; gross of this car, \$2,001. We also sold a car from Medford of the celebrated Hillcrest brand Comice, the half boxes extra fancy, making an average of \$2.80, the full boxes fancy, \$4.00, and the second grade full boxes, \$3.45, the gross of this car being \$1,700. This shows you what a strong market is ruling here and we regret that our friends have not sent us pears as we have been advising right along.

Apples—The terrible hot weather during the past week has certainly affected the market, the temperature today being 80. One car of Colorado Jonathans sold today at \$1.80 on the wrapped and \$1.65 on the unwrapped. One car from Hood River, perfectly beautiful, with a deep red color, sold at \$2.00, and a car from Washington, very good fruit but not of high color, made \$1.75. We badly need colder weather to make a better market on apples and we look for it shortly. We have you are shipping us.

LAST OF WINTER PEARS GO FOWARD

The California Fruit Distributors say:

The following gives the number of cars of deciduous fruit shipped from all points in California for the week ending Friday morning, October 7:

Peaches, 1 car—For the past six days there have been no shipments of peaches at all and it is expected that the one car which left September 30, will be the last car of this variety for the season of 1910.

Pears, 14 cars—The last of the winter pears are now going forward and there will probably not be more than ten to fifteen cars in the state after this week.

Grapes, 458 cars—Movement of grapes this week compared with that of last week, when a total of 611 cars was reached, shows a material falling off. This will probably be true of the following week and it is expected that there will be a corresponding decline during that time. From present indications the next ten days will practically wind up Tokay shipments, after which there will be a few hundred cars of Emperors and Cornichons to move. All trace of rain damage has disappeared and remaining stock should show first-class keeping qualities.

Weather conditions continue favorable, being of rain. The season has been a very favorable one for moving out the grape crop.

ARREST OF PRIESTS

ACTIVE IN PORTUGAL
LISBON, Oct. 10.—The arrest of monks and nuns throughout Portugal continued today accompanied by looting and sacrilege on the part of uncontrolled mobs. The government is at a loss for a place to send the priests condemned to exile. The republican agents have confiscated church property, but are unable to prevent looting. Priests and nuns, it is reported, have been subjected to indignities, and many are said to have been slain.

Cardinal Netto, former patriarch of Lisbon, and Bishop de Vanconcelos of Beja were escorted across the frontier into Spain. The Marquis de Ohmbel, head of the Jesuits in Portugal, is under arrest. Children in parochial monasteries and convent schools have been returned to their homes.
