SPOKANE, Wash., Oct. 11.-Official announceemnt was made today by Ren H. Rice, secretary and manager of the National Apple show, that entries in earload contests for prizes aggregating \$3,800, including the emhampionship sweepstake of \$1,000 will close in Spokane at 12 o'clock noon on November 6. Entries in other contests for \$16,200 in premiums will be accepted up to 6 o'clock the afternoon of November 9. Professor H. F. an Deman and his assistants will begin judging on the morning of November 14 with a view to completing their work on November 18.

"The rule requiring that each exhibit, except district displays, must be of fruit grown on one orchard \$36 ton; earley, \$32 ton. only, is not open to broad construction," Mr. Rice added. "It means, 5 1/2 c. just what it says. The reason for insisting that an exhibit shall be taken from one orehard is to make the competitions fair.
