Temporary Heat Quickly

Did you ever stop to think of the many ways in which a perfect oil heater is of value? Apply a match in the morning, when you get out of bed, and you have heat while you dress.

The girl who practices on the piano in a cold room in the morning can have warmth from an oil heater while she plays, and then turn it off. The member of the family who has to walk the floor on a cold winter's night with a restless baby can get temporary heat with an oil heater, and then turn it off. The
