

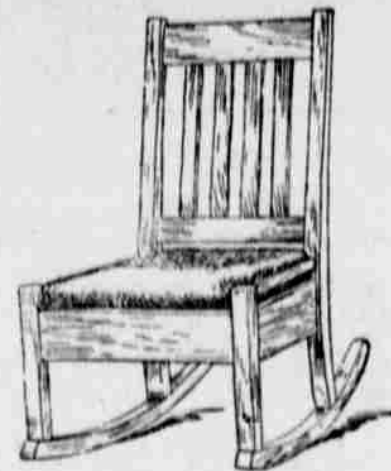

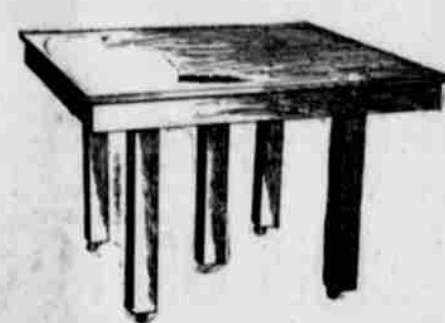

PORTLAND AGAIN SHUTS LOS ANGELES OUT; SCORE, 3-0

PORTLAND, Oct. 15.—Eighty-five consecutive innings of baseball without being scored against. That's the way the fans write it now.
 Portland has gone baseball mad. With the Beavers playing faultless ball, shattering world's records by playing for 85 innings without letting a rival team in the Pacific Coast League score a run, the mark set by Pittsburgh in 1907 at 82 has been passed and a mark set which in the opinion of Mr. B. B. Bug, will stand for many years to come, the entire population is planning to visit the baseball park tomorrow and witness the double header which will close the season in this city.
 In spite of the fact that Portland lost three games by a ruling of President Graham of the league the club today by her victory over Los Angeles and the failure of Oakland to win from San Francisco jumps back to a safe margin of 12 points, according to Graham's score, while on the dope sheet of the Portland fans she is 37 points to the good.
 Steen pitched a splendid game today. He allowed Los Angeles but one hit and no runs, while Portland annexed eight hits from Tozer and touched the home plate three times.
