

CATTLE MARKET REMAINS STEADY

PORTLAND, Ore., Oct. 17.—Receipts on this market for the last week have been as follows: Cattle, 1012, calves 511, hogs 2525, sheep 3097, goats 222, and H. & M. 32.

Cattle remain steady at former quotations. Receipts have not been heavy and the quality of the stuff offered has not justified buyers paying top prices.

Buyers have not been able to get the price of hogs down to \$9.50 as they predicted last week and it is now the feeling among shippers that they will hold up around \$10 for some time.

The sheep market has shown little change with the exception of an increased demand for the better grades. Good lambs are steady at \$5.25 and wethers, not too heavy, at \$4.25; ewes at from \$3 to \$3.25.
