An ordinance declaring the cost of improvement of alleys in block 3 and 13 of the original townsite and assessing the property benefited thereby, and declaring such assessment, and directing the entry thereof in the docket of the city liens.

THE CITY OF MEDFORD DOTH ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That no protest having been filed against the improvement of alleys in block 3 and 13 due to the notice of the intention of the council to cause said improvement to be made having been given and said improvement having been ordered made, the council considered the matter and herewith ascertains the cost of making such improvement to be the sum of \$1919.95. 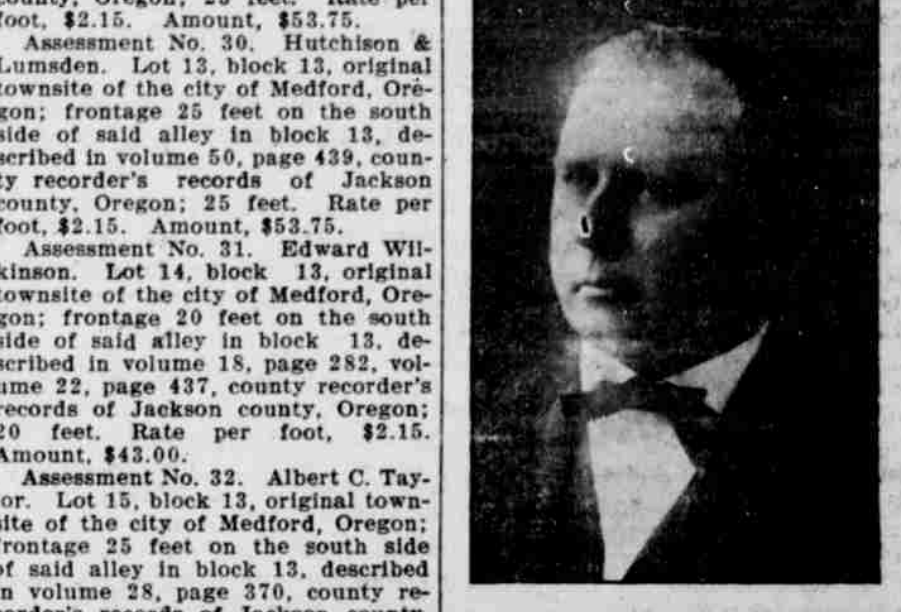
