

BETTER DEMAND FOR APPLES

Market Especially Strong in Middle and Northwestern Territory—Demand for Jonathans Unsatisfactory Feature.

The Northwestern Fruit Exchange of Portland issues the following under date of Oct. 31:

We are glad to report a much better demand, which is especially strong in middle and southwestern territory. Texas and Oklahoma are in the market, and apparently these markets have cleaned up to a large extent on the recent glut of poor stuff from Colorado and other central producing points.

Chicago is not keeping pace with the balance of the country, as it still continues rather sluggish, and the trade still inclined to hold. D states still is inclined to hold off.
