CROWDS WATCH CREW FACE DEATH

Unable to Help, Lifesavers Stand on Shore and See Thirty Men Cling to Rigging in Wreck With No Hope of Escape.

DOVER, Eng., Nov. 7.—Unable to give aid, life savers and thousands of spectators today watched thirty members of the wrecked five masted schooner *Preussen* face death in the rigging of the vessel.

The *Preussen*, the largest sailing vessel in the world, which is owned in Germany, was driven ashore after a collision with the steamship *Brighton* Channel, Sunday. The *Brighton* Channel was able to reach port, but the *Preussen* was beached on the rocky head of South Foreland.

After the *Preussen* struck she began breaking up. The crew was driven to the rigging, where they lashed themselves to the shrouds, awaiting aid from the shore. Lifelines and tugs, however, are unable to reach the wreck, and as the storm shows no signs of abating, all hope of saving them alive has been abandoned.

EXPECT 5000 AT O.A.C.-U.O. GAME

Many People From Eugene Will Accompany Football Team on Their Trip to Face Their Ancient Foes—O. A. C. Team is Lighted.

CORVALLIS, Nov. 7.—Great preparations are now in progress at the Oregon Agricultural college for the annual contest between the football teams of the university and the agricultural college. It is expected that more than 5000 people will be in attendance at this game. Besides the entire student body of this institution, members of the faculty and a great number of citizens of Corvallis, there will be the student body from Eugene with the faculty and a large following of townspeople. Also many members of the alumni of both institutions and others who are interested in the schools will be present. Bleachers are being built which will have a seating capacity of over 3000 people. These with the grandstand and the bleachers, which are now erected will take care of the enormous crowd.

The intense athletic rivalry which exists between the students of these two institutions is certain to make the game one of exceptional merit. The members of the agricultural college team will be much lighter than their opponents, but they have been working exceptionally hard and feel that it is a chance to offset this handicap. Keck's wonderful ability as a kicker is a factor of no small importance in favor of the college men. On the other hand, greater weight and the fact that the university men are more mature and more experienced, gives the university a better chance in the game.

INSURGENT IN IDAHO WILL WIN

Prospects for Democratic Success Are Poor—Both Candidates for Governorship Claim Victory—Prospects Favor Brady.

BOISE, Idaho, Nov. 7.—With only the outcome of the gubernatorial contest reasonably doubtful, democratic leaders admitted that the prospects for democratic success tomorrow in Idaho were exceedingly gloomy. The campaign which came to a final ending today has been pepper and the various candidates have stumped the state from border to border.

Comparatively little interest has been taken in the congressional campaign and republican committeemen assert that with Idaho's normal republican majority of 17,000 considered, there is little doubt but that Burton I. French, progressive republican, will be elected to congress over his democratic opponent, Arthur Bowen.

Chief interest in the election centers about the governorship. Governor James Brady, republican, is for re-election, and is opposed by James H. Hawley, democrat. Both sides lay claim to victory by substantial margins. The campaign hinged on the liquor question. The republicans declared in favor of submitting a constitutional amendment for state wide prohibition in Idaho, while the democrats stood pat on the present local option law. Brady is an out and out prohibitionist and as the lines are closely drawn between the wets and dries and the local option elections throughout the state have shown an overwhelming sentiment in favor of dry issues, his managers declare that Brady is as good as elected.

On the other hand the democrats assert that Hawley will get the support of the republican wet element with which the solid backing of his party, they say, will carry him through.

Much depends on the Mormon vote in the southeastern counties. There has been no indication up to the present time, however, that they will vote on other than party lines.

The voting population of Idaho is approximately 100,000.

MANY ENTRIES FOR RACES AT EMERYVILLE

SAN FRANCISCO, Cal., Nov. 7.—Five hundred and ninety-one entries have been received by the new California Jockey club, whose race meet opens at Emeryville next Saturday for the 12 stake events to be run during the season. Among the classy performers entered in the more important events are such horses as Bubbling Water, Stanley Fay, Spellbound and Amose. Twenty horses are entered in the opening handicap, to be run Saturday.

Each team has won the majority of its games and defeated its opponents. Both claim the conference championship, but there is little likelihood that they will meet, as talk of a post-season game is being discouraged.
