Gold medal banners and special prizes will be awarded to the best collection of apples grown on irrigated and non-irrigated lands, exhibited by commercial clubs, associations, unions, counties or districts. Any number of varieties may be entered. There is no restriction on the number of apples used and the judging will take into consideration the general arrangement, attractiveness, pack, varieties, condition and color.

These entries are exclusive of those competing in the carload and other classes for prizes and premiums of a total of \$20,000. The judging will begin on November 14 and it is expected to complete the work in time to announce the awards on November 17.
