

**TURKEYCROP THIS YEAR A LARGE ONE**

Plenty of Thanksgiving Material Assured—Prices as Yet Uncertain, But Will Not Soar Out of Sight This Year.

There will be in all probability plenty of turkeys for the Thanksgiving season this year, and for the holidays later. While it is impossible at this time to forecast values a few weeks hence, the commission trader is pretty generally agreed that the supply of birds will be a liberal one.

In the western Oregon counties where turkey raising is one of the important industries, weather conditions generally this season were ideal for the production of the birds. Turkeys require dry weather, consequently the losses of young birds through unfavorable weather this year were reduced to the minimum.

What turkeys will be worth at Thanksgiving time is in no way indicated by the prices prevailing now, and as a rule dealers are averse to making predictions regarding values in the holiday season.

**PRECOOLING OF FRUIT UNDERTAKEN**

PORTLAND, Or., Nov. 8.—Experiments in pre-cooling Willamette valley fruit shipped to eastern markets will be undertaken as an experiment by the government.

H. J. Ramsey, one of the government investigators, will reach Salem early in November and will look over the facilities for precooling work. A special car, operated by the government, will be sent to Salem to carry on the experiments.

**LOGGED OVER LANDS FOR APPLE ORCHARDS**

PORTLAND, Or., Nov. 8.—An interesting experiment is being tried in the vicinity of Yacolt, Wash., where logged-over lands are being transformed into apple orchards.

Gangs of Japanese laborers are now pulling out the stumps. Young apple trees will supplant them. Recent investigation seems to show that excellent apples are possible not only in the better known apple districts, but that the growing of prize fruit is more a matter of intelligent care than of locality.

**APPLE QUEEN DUE NOVEMBER 11**

Spokane Making Great Preparations for National Apple Show Soon to Be Held—Governor Hay Will Act as Prime Minister.

SPOKANE, Wash., Nov. 8.—Idell I. Queen-elect of the third National Apple show, who is Miss Mary I. Ide, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. G. B. Ide of Colville, Wash., in private life, will enter her domain at 5:35 o'clock the afternoon of November 11.

Mayor Pratt will present the queen-elect an elaborately wrought golden key, symbolic of the freedom of the city of Spokane, and following this ceremony he will conduct Her Highness to the state carriage, where will be presided the matron and maids of honor.

It is expected that Idell I will give some intimation of the imperial policy before the opening of the show, after which the royal proclamation will be issued through her prime minister, Governor Marion E. Hay, who will arrive in Spokane on November 13, remaining until the evening of November 15.
