

"Prince of Pilsen" Saturday



"The Prince of Pilsen," the musical comedy of perennial charm and beauty, will be presented at the Medford Saturday evening by a cast of remarkable individual and collective ability and attractiveness. It is now in its eighth year of unexampled success, and so long a term of popularity rarely falls to the lot of this evanescent style of theatrical entertainment. Gustav Laders and Frank Pixley contributed their best work to "The Prince of Pilsen," giving to it the inspiration born of a romantic theme in a picturesque setting. The enduring quality of Mr. Laders' music and the ever fresh and interesting turn of Frank Pixley's story and lyrics give to this musical comedy the distinction of a classic and sharply differentiate it from the ordinary "pot boilers" of the stage, written under the stress of special orders and to the measure of a stage's ability and individual mannerism. The beautiful background of the story—Nice during the Carnival of Flowers—suggests romance and inspires poesy and harmony. Beautiful scenic pictures, costumes of ravishing beauty and the charm of pretty girls and the handsome men unite in giving the "Prince of Pilsen"

such favor and success as rarely fall to musical comedy. Manager Savage in sending the piece upon its eighth American tour gave individual attention to its cast and equipment. Jess Dandy, who has played the part of Hans Wagner more than 1000 times, will again give expression to the comedy role of the American brewer who had the honors intended for a prince thrust upon him. Mr. Dandy's topical song "Imagination" is an interpolated number that scores heavily. Frances Cameron, a dashing and piquant actress, who played the role of the Dashing Widow two seasons ago, assumes the same part in the present tour. Edward Mora will again be seen in the role of the real Prince, and his singing of the "Stein Song" with the chorus of Heidelberg students in one of the pleasing features of the performance. Ivor Anderson has his old part of the young naval officer. Robert O'Connell has prominence in comedy and song. Dainty Vera B. Stanley is the daughter of a rich brewer, and Lillian Lawson, a dancing sylph, has the part of Simone, a French maid. The coming of the Prince of Pilsen marks the highest point of the season's interests in high class musical entertainment.

VESSADE ACQUITTED OF MURDER IN LAKEVIEW

LAKEVIEW, Nov. 9.—The jury in the trial of Louis Vessade for the killing of John F. Barry at this place last summer in a saloon row, after being out but a short time, brought in a verdict of acquittal. The case has aroused considerable interest here on account of the prominence of the dead man, who was well known throughout this section of Oregon. The sentiment of a majority of the citizens is favorable to the verdict and Vessade is receiving the congratulations of everyone. Attorneys Late Conn and Lair Thompson fought for the defendant in a masterly manner and as they were appointed by the court, their efforts are receiving much commendation. District Attorney Kuykendall was assisted in the prosecution by Judge W. H. Benson of Klamath Falls. There are rumors on the street that the district attorney has refused to issue writs for some of the state's witnesses who are charged by the defense with perjury.

TAYLOR IS PROBABLY DEFEATED IN TENNESSEE

NASHVILLE, Tenn., Nov. 9.—32 counties out of 96 are estimated on those remaining, Ben W. Hoopes, fusion candidate, is elected governor over Senator Taylor, who showed the expected strength in Western Tennessee. For congress Austin (rep.) defeated Hale (dem.) in the second; Moon (dem.) wins in the third; Hirt (dem.) in the fourth; Sells (rep.) in the first; Sims (dem.) in the eighth.

Madison's Election in Doubt

HUTCHINSON, Kan., Nov. 9.—On straight ballots cast in Hutchinson and two counties, Neely (dem.) for congress, seventh district, has a majority of 590 over Madison. Madison carried the two counties two years ago by 564. Indications are that Madison's majority of 4900 in the district two years ago has been wiped out and his re-election is in doubt.

Arkansas Democrats

LITTLE ROCK, Ark., Nov. 9.—W. E. Mason, W. A. Oldfield, J. C. C. Floyd, W. B. Cravens, H. M. Jacobson, J. T. Robinson and W. S. Goodwin, democrats, congressional candidates, have been elected, according to figures given out by the democratic campaign managers here.

ALDRICH CLAIMS HIS ELECTION IN NEBRASKA

OMAHA, Neb., Nov. 9.—With 11 counties out of the 51 in the state heard from, the election of Chester H. Aldrich, republican, as governor of Nebraska seems assured by a majority of not less than 10,000. Thirteen of these counties give Aldrich a majority of 4200. The 14th, Douglas county, Dahlman's own, gave Dahlman a majority of 8000. The same 13 counties two years ago gave Shallenberger, democrat, a majority of 500. There is a change this year of 4000 votes. With Aldrich's majority practically assured in most of the counties not yet heard from, it is deemed certain that Dahlman's lead in Douglas will be easily overcome. The election of Hitchcock is conceded by all. He will carry the state by 25,000, said Mr. Hitchcock tonight. These figures may be increased.

Chairman of the republican state central committee has just slightly elapsed the state by 29,000 majority. The democratic state central committee officials do make a statement of the gubernatorial race. The state legislature is probably democratic.

Florida Democrat

JACKSONVILLE, Fla., Nov. 9.—S. M. Shirkman, Frank Clark and D. H. Mays, democrats, were elected to congress without opposition yesterday. Returns on the statewide prohibition amendment are coming in very slowly, with both sides claiming victory.

Danforth Goes Back

ROCHESTER, N. Y., Nov. 9.—H. G. Danforth, republican, is elected to congress in the 32d district, succeeding Hayses, democrat.
