### ANARCHISTS ON TRIAL IN JAPAN

Great Excitement Aroused Over Supposed Plot to Take Mikado's Life  
---Woman Among Those Accused  
---Planned Reign of Terror.

TOKIO, Nov. 9.—The greatest excitement was aroused in Japan today by the announcement that the trial of 26 alleged anarchists arrested three weeks ago for a supposed plot to take the life of the mikado would shortly be begun. Among the suspected anarchists is a woman, Suga Kanno, who will be tried along with the others. She is said to be the mistress of Genjiro oKtoku, leader of the band.

The attempt of the alleged plotters against the mikado is being accepted seriously and it is the general belief that in arresting the 26 suspects the authorities have nipped a widespread anarchistic movement in the empire in the bud.

Kotoku, according to general belief, brought the anarchistic beliefs of his followers from America, where he went in 1906. He is an ardent student of Kropotkin's publications. It is believed he and his followers were planning a reign of terror to be brought about by labor difficulties and assassinations.

### CYCLONE THOMPSON BESTS BOER UNHOLZ

SYDNEY, N. S. W., Nov. 9.—Cyclone Johnny Thompson of Newmore, Ill., easily defeated Rudolph (Boer) Unholz of South Africa in their bout at the Stadium before a crowd of 12,000 today.

The bout only went six rounds and was stopped by the police to save Unholz from further punishment, as the American had all the best of the bout. Unholz was knocked down seven times in the last two rounds. It was an unscientific fight, rough-and-tumble battle, but it demonstrated that the Boer could not "come back."

### FIVE MORE MINERS TAKEN OUT FROM PIT

TRINIDAD, Col., Nov. 9.—Five more miners were taken from the Victor American Fuel company's mine shortly before noon today, making 14 rescued alive. The men were brought to the surface in a semi-conscious condition, but soon were revived. It was announced that all would recover.

### STOCKS DROP IN PRICE IN WALL STREET TODAY

NEW YORK, Nov. 9.—Stocks dropped in Wall street today, following the election. United States Steel was depressed and the whole list sold off sharply. Union Pacific fell 1 1/2 and Steel 1 1/2; Missouri Pacific, 2; Great Northern, 1 1/4, and Northern Pacific 1; Wabash preferred, 1 1/2. Bonds were irregular.

### BOTH PARTIES CLAIM SUCCESS IN COLORADO

DENVER, Colo., Nov. 9.—Both democrats and republicans today claim to have won the gubernatorial contest and the result probably will not be known before night.

Fully 70 per cent of the ballots were scratched. Congressional fights were close and until the count has proceeded further it will be impossible to say who has been elected. Both parties are claiming a plurality of 2000.

### ALDRICH IS ELECTED GOVERNOR OF NEBRASKA

OMAHA, Neb., Nov. 9.—Returns from 400 rural Nebraska precincts show that Chester H. Aldrich (rep.) is leading in the race for governor by 9000 plurality. It is predicted that his ultimate plurality will be 20,000.

The legislature is democratic. For congress, Norris and Kineaid, (rep.) and Latta and Lobeck (dem.) are fairly certain of election. Hayward (rep.) and McGuire (dem.) are close, with the former having a slight advantage.

### THREE EARTHQUAKE SHOCKS IN BEHRING SEA REGION

UNIVERSITY OF WASHINGTON, Seattle, Nov. 8.—Indicating several severe tremors in the Behring sea region or adjacent districts, the seismograph at the university has registered in the last three days a series of earthquake shocks. Last night two distinct shocks were marked on the sheet, one being at 10:25 and continuing until 11:05 p. m. The other commenced at 12:20 this morning and lasting until 12:50, the disturbances covering a period for two and one-half hours.

Early Sunday afternoon the instrument recorded the most severe shock which has been registered in the last eight months. The needle was rocked entirely off the sheet on this occasion, and an accurate reading was, therefore, impossible.

NEW YORK, Nov. 9.—Socialist headquarters claim an increase of from 15 to 100 per cent in all of the cities in this state. In Buffalo they received 3000, as against 775 in 1908.

TRENTON, N. J., Nov. 9.—Woodrow Wilson (dem.) is surely elected governor of New Jersey by not less than 20,000. He has carried Hudson county by more than 12,000 and Essex county by more than 10,000, Hunterdon county by nearly 2000 and Warren county by 1600.
