SOUTHERN PACIFIC FILES YEARLY REPORT

SALEM, Or., Nov. 12.—According to the report made by the Southern Pacific company to the Oregon railroad commission this morning, the operating revenues in the state of Oregon for the year closing June 30, 1910, were \$8,659,945.28 and operating expenses were \$4,520,526.12. This is a net operating revenue of \$4,139,419.12. The Southern Pacific's total operating revenues, including the state of Oregon, for the year ending June 30, 1910, were \$95,189,064.90 and expenses were \$52,628,529.98, making net operating revenue for year of \$42,560,474.72. Dividends were paid amounting to \$22,976,039.28. The gross corporate income of the corporation is shown to be \$72,470,542.43 and after deducting taxes, dividends, leases and interests on bonds, surplus left of \$8,897,614.38.

KAISER'S ONLY DAUGHTER BETROTHED TO ROUMANIAN

BERLIN, Nov. 12.—It is heard in German circles that the engagement of the kaiser's only daughter with young Prince Carol of Roumania will soon be announced. The princess bears the names Victoria Louise. The former is after her great grandmother, Queen Victoria of England, and the latter after her great aunt, Princess Louise, duchess of Fife. This charming young princess has the "tombolish" qualities of the young girl who has come a good hit with her brothers. She is now 18, but the German emperor is in early marriage. A futile effort was made to secure her hand for the young king of Portugal.

A Plea To Study Socialism

To the Editor:

If possible, I wish through the Mail Tribune to disabuse the minds of some of our good church-going folks and some of our preachers, too, who, not being familiar with the grand teachings of socialism, encourage us for holding meetings on Sundays, just here allow me to say that our Sunday afternoon meetings at the Socialists' hall on North G street are becoming very interesting, there being visitors and speakers from abroad every Sunday of late. The socialists today are the same to society as was John the Baptist in his day. We are the voice of many crying, prepare, teach the nations of the world for a greater, better and a higher plane of civilization than the world has ever heretofore known anything of.

Socialism, carried to its ultimate conclusions, would be an industrial democracy which would give the equal right to all to work and produce wealth for their own use and enjoyment.

I will here quote an excerpt from some of Debs' explanations:

Socialism will eliminate the incentive "desire" for rascality. How?

By stamping every article at the labor cost of production, adding the cost of raw material and all miscellaneous expenditures.

To those who have studied the great fundamental principles of socialism, they see, know and understand how the great change will come into play. For illustration, choose, if you please, the greatest speculator or the worst rascal that you can find. Place either one of them in the postoffice, under a regular postmaster's contract and commission. Think you that in either case they would for an instant consider how much extra money they could make by selling postage stamps for a few cents more than the stamps call for? I tell you no—they would never think of such a thing. So every thing or article that will be sold will have the nation's cost price stamped thereon and will be sold for that price everywhere in the United States.

We socialists do not for a moment think that socialism will change human nature in an instant, but we know that it will bring into existence economic and social conditions that will bring the best out that is in humanity.

Let all children be born into the world under the right economic and social conditions for, say a hundred years, and there will be no liars, no thieves, no robbers and no murderers.
