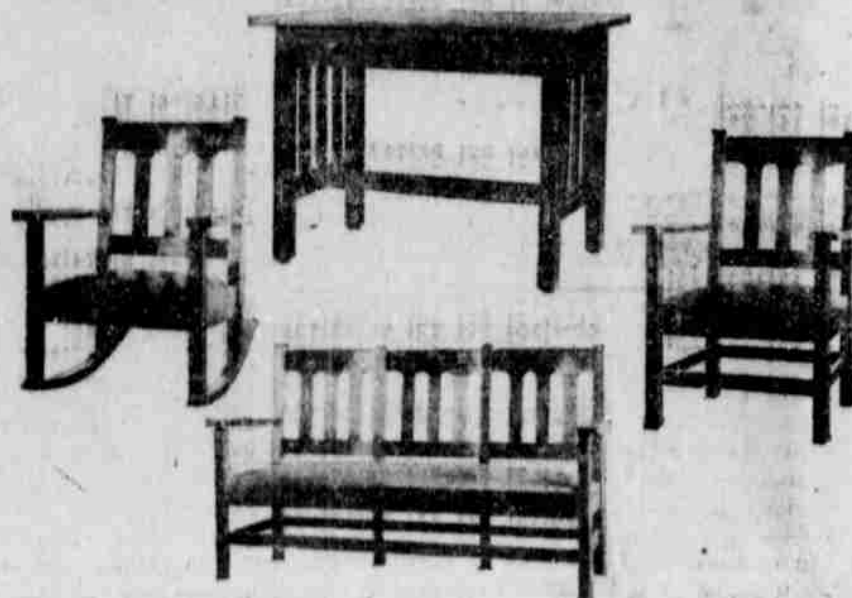

YALE COMES BACK AND PUTS IT ON PRINCETON 5-3

Game Is Very Close and Is Featured by Punting and Marred by Numerous Fumbles — Princeton Went into Game an 8 to 3 Favorite.

PRINCETON, N. J., Nov. 12.—In a close game featured by plenty of punting and marred by numerous fumbles, Yale won from Princeton this afternoon by a score of 5 to 3. Kilpatrick's touchdown after a beautiful pass by Howe turned the trick for Old Eli.

Princeton went on the field an 8 to 3 favorite and Yale's victory caused surprise to the critics and regrets to the bettors, although wagering was not heavy.

At noon a snow storm swept the field, but it soon was over. The weather became cold and blustery. The betting before the game was light, owing to Yale's weak showing

this year. Just before the kickoff the odds were 8 to 3 on Princeton. Yale's contingent of rioters was in the west stands, while Princeton's occupied the other structure.

Daly caught Ballou's kickoff and Yale gained consistently.

Daly fumbled the ball on Princeton's 25-yard line, but Pendleton was twice thrown back for a loss and Ballou was forced to punt to safety.

A punting duel between Ballou and Hart followed.

Daly fumbled on Princeton's 18-yard line and Princeton rushed the ball down the field, enabling Pendleton to kick goal. Score: Yale 0, Princeton 3.

Snow fell in flurries during the second quarter. With the ball on Princeton's 33-yard line, Ballou punted. Kissler carried the ball back to Princeton's 32-yard line, but Yale was penalized 15 yards for holding. A punting duel sent the ball to Yale's 35-yard line. Pendleton failed in an attempt at a placement goal. The half ended with punting. Princeton 3, Yale 0.

In the last quarter Yale made a touchdown. Final score, Yale 5, Princeton 3.

PHILADELPHIA, Pa., Nov. 12.—Pennsylvania and Michigan fought tooth and nail for an advantage when they lined up against each other here today, with neither side

able to gain an advantage. Neither scored during the game.

NEW HAVEN, Conn., Nov. 12.—Harvard freshmen won from Yale Freshmen today, 14 to 9. Chatfield of Harvard sustained concussion of the brain and was rushed to the hospital. His condition was reported serious and an operation may be necessary in order to save his life.
