GEORGE BROWN PIONEER DEAD

Former County Commissioner Well-Known Resident og Eagle Point Passes Away After Two Months' Illness.

News was received from Eagle Point last evening of the death, after an illness extending over two months, of George Brown, former county commissioner and a wellknown pioneer of Jackson county, he having made his home in this valley continuously since the year 1862. He was born in Yorkshire, England, in 1833, removed with his parents to the State of Wisconsin when a child, grew to manhood on a farm hear Rochester, Wis., and after his marringe to Miss Mary J. Tinker in 1858, and a few years spent in Wisconsin, he was induced by a brother, Henry Brown, now decensed, to remove to outhern Oregon, crossing the plains with his wife and only child, the means of transportation heing an ox team.

He was a carpenter by trade and followed that avocation while not engaged in mining in the Jacksonville placer district until about the year 1880. For a number of years he was ineapacitated for work by stone is the bladder, for which he underwent an iperation in the Lane hospital m San Francisco in 1886, afterward regaining perfect health.

Eleven children were born to him and his wife, the latter preceding him to the grave two years ago last Anril. All of the children but one are still living, a son having perished in 1888 from an accidental gunshot wound. With one exception, Mrs. Sarah B. Gaerin of Portland, all o. his sons and daughters now reside a Jackson county, and all will attend his mortal remains to their final resting place in the Jacksonville ceme

Mr. Brown was a man of forceful character and throughout his career his name was a synonym for honesty and integrity, and among all th sterling pioneer glement of the Rogne River valley not one has woo and beld the esteem and regard o his fellowmen to a greater degrethan the deceased. The funeral will he held at the beautiful Evergreen egmetery at Jacksonville tomorrow (Monday) aftermon at 2 o'clock Services only at the grave, conducted by Rev. Shields of Medford.
