

APPLE MARKET IS MOST DIFFICULT

The Northwestern Fruit Exchange in a recent market bulletin says:

The market situation continues exceedingly difficult, and the demand is sluggish and critical. The trade are hard to interest except at very low prices. There is considerable accumulation at gateway points and the trade know this, and it keeps them from buying. What a pity that the whole northwest is not thoroughly organized and that the different producing sections do not join hands and present a solid front to the trade and avoid this foolish and unnecessary overcrowding of the markets, and by achieving a wide distribution keep the situation healthy at all times. This is the salvation of the industry, and the sooner the northwest fruit growers come to understand this, the sooner will the business be placed on a sound, conservative basis, to which it is entitled by its importance and value. Until that time the growers are more or less at the mercy of the market.
