HAYWOOD TURNS UP IN WELSH COAL FIELD

LONDON, Nov. 19.—The presence of William D. Haywood of Colorado, a member of the Western Federation of Miners, in the Welsh coal fields, where extra police and militia have been required to check rioting of strikers, is interesting the authorities who have to cope with the situation.

Considerable tension prevails among the miners. Several continental labor leaders are in the district, but the authorities are acquainted with their methods of conducting strikes, a knowledge which is lacking in the case of American labor chiefs.

Haywood has addressed the miners at demonstrations. Though the strikers are quiet, some undercurrents manifest themselves and as a precaution the militia, which is made up of miners, has been ordered to return to the supply station any ammunition it may possess.

MACHINE INVENTED TO SEND MESSAGES

VANCOUVER, B. C., Nov. 19.—Greater cable speed and lower rates for messages is promised if successful follows experiments about to be made with a new apparatus at the Pacific cable station at Bamfield. It is a new cable receiving and transmitting apparatus, the invention of E. Hurley of London.

It promises to increase the speed of messages 50 per cent and this in effect will be followed by a reduction in the cost of transmitting messages.

Hurley is here with John Milward of Sydney, president of the cable board. They will jointly conduct the experiments for the next 30 days at Bamfield on the longest stretch of the Pacific cable—Bamfield Island to Fanning Island, 3450 miles.

WILL BURY AVIATOR JOHNSTONE TODAY

KANSAS CITY, Mo., Nov. 19.—The body of Ralph Johnstone, who was crushed to death in an aeroplane accident at Denver a few days ago, arrived here this afternoon. Walter Brookins, one of his team mates, who was on the ground preparing to fly when Johnstone fell, accompanied the body from Denver. There was

no curious crowd at the station when the train arrived. Two reporters greeted Brookins.

The dead aviator will be buried tomorrow, the body resting beside that of his mother. His widow will arrive this afternoon, as will also Wilbur Wright. Johnstone was one of the Wright aviators.
