CITY OF MEDFORD, State of Oregon IMPROVEMENT BOND Know all men by these presents, that the city of Medford, in the county of Jackson, state of Oregon, for value received, hereby agrees and promises to pay the bearer the sum of ... dollars in gold coin of the United States of America, on the presentation and surrender of the obligation on the ... day of ... in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and ... without grace, with interest thereon from the date hereof until redeemed, or until the time of the semi-annual interest payment next ensuing the publication of notice by the city of Medford that this bond will be taken up and cancelled and the interest thereon will cease at the interest payment period next following such publication, at the rate of six per cent per annum, payable semi-annually, in like coin on the ... day of ... and ... in each year, on the presentation and surrender of the proper coupons thereto annexed, principal and interest payable at the office of the treasurer of the city of Medford.

This bond is one of a series authorized by an act of the legislative assembly of the state of Oregon, entitled "An act to provide for the issuance of bonds for the improvement of streets and the laying of sewers in incorporated cities and for the payment of the cost of such improvements and laying of sewers by installments," filed in the office of the secretary of state February 22, 1892, as amended by an act entitled "An act to amend sections 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6 and 7 of an act entitled 'An act to provide for the issuance of bonds for the improvement of streets and the laying of sewers in incorporated cities, and for the payment of the cost of such improvements and laying of sewers by installments,' filed in the office of the secretary of state February 22, 1892, approved February 28th, 1892," and is an obligation of the city of Medford, aforesaid, and is not to be deemed or taken to be within or any part of the limitation by law as to the indebtedness of said city, and it is further certified that all requirements of law have been fully complied with by the proper officers in the issuing of this bond, and that the total amount of this issue does not exceed the limit prescribed by said act.

This bond is redeemable at the office of said treasurer at the option of the city of Medford upon the payment of the face value thereof, with accrued interest to the date of payment at any semi-annual coupon period at or after one year from the date hereof, as provided by said act.

For the fulfillment of the conditions of this obligation the faith and credit of the city of Medford are hereby pledged. Each of said bonds shall have attached thereto twenty coupons, each of which shall be in the following form: CITY OF MEDFORD, State of Oregon Will pay to the bearer ... dollars in gold coin of the United States of America, at the office of the treasurer of said city, on the ... day of ... being six months' interest on improvement bond No. ... unless said bond is sooner redeemed as therein provided, which redemption will render this coupon void. Record of the City of Medford. Said coupons shall be numbered from one to twenty respectively. Section 4. The mayor of said city is hereby authorized and directed to sign said bonds and the city recorder so countersign the same by attaching thereto the seal of said city, all on behalf of said city.

Section 5. The recorder of the city of Medford is hereby directed to advertise said bonds for sale and that the same will be sold for the highest price obtainable, not less than par and accrued interest, and in said advertisement he shall announce that he will receive sealed proposals for the purchase of said bonds or any portion thereof at his office at any time before 4:30 p. m. on the 6th day of December, 1910. He shall publish said advertisement three times in a daily newspaper published and printed in said city, and shall submit the sealed proposals received in accordance with said advertisement to the council at its next meeting thereafter.

DOG LEAPS 200 FEET INTO RIVER; IS UNHURT

Spokane, Nov. 28.—Jumping 200 feet off the Columbia river bridge at Wenatelle, Wash., southwest of Spokane, into the Columbia river and returning to its master apparently unharmed, was the experience of a shepherd dog, owned by the manager of a garage. The dog's master had received a call that an automobile was out of gasoline on the Douglas county side of the river and he set out to carry a supply, the following behind. When the helpless machine had been filled the two automobiles started for the city over the bridge. In the center of the bridge one machine endeavored to circle around the other and get ahead. The dog, seeing that it was to be caught in a trap, jumped from the bridge. Being dark the master considered that he had the end of the dog. About two hours afterward a scratch was chanced at the door and upon its being opened the dog entered, wagging its tail, and showed its nose into its master's hand. Aside from a drenching the dog showed no signs of injury after battling with the swift current in the Columbia river.
