

TOLSTOI'S LAST LITERARY WORK

Writer's Final Efforts Were Against Capital Punishment—Author Says He Is Anxious to Do All He Can Against Evil

ST. PETERSBURG, Nov. 28.—The Associated Press received early today from Vladimir Tschertkoff, literary agent of the late Count Tolstoi, the last article written by Tolstoi. It was entitled "Effective Means."

The article says: "I am naturally anxious to do all I can against evil, which tortures the best spirits of our time."

"I think the present effective war against capital punishment does not need forcing; there is no need for an expression of indignation against its immorality, cruelty and absurdity. There is no need for descriptions of the horrors of executions, as they only affect hangmen."

"Therefore I think that neither the expression of indignation against the murder of our fellow men nor the suggestion of its horror is mainly needed, but something totally different."

"What knowledge need we communicate to the deluded mind regarding the indispensableness, usefulness or justice of capital punishment in order that said delusion may destroy itself."

"Such knowledge, in my opinion, is this: His knowledge of what is man, what his surrounding world; what his destiny; hence, what man can and must do and principally what he cannot and must not do."

"Therefore we should oppose capital punishment by inculcating this knowledge to all men, especially to hangmen's managers and sympathizers who wrongfully think they are maintaining their position, thanks only to capital punishment."

BETTER QUALITY BEEF NOW BEING RECEIVED

PORTLAND, Or., Nov. 28.—The receipts on this market for the week ending today have been as follows: Cattle, 1719; calves, 103; hogs, 1204. Sheep, 6817; goats, 229, and horses, 15.

As a whole the receipts in cattle have been of a better quality than heretofore and have commanded better prices. Buyers seem to want the better grades and are willing to pay the price when they can get the stuff. Cows have remained steady, some extra fine Montana heifers brought \$5, but the majority of the sales run from \$4.50 to \$4.75. Light calves are in good demand with very few offerings.

Owing to the heavy receipts in sheep, the market has declined somewhat from the high plane established the first of the week. Good wethers are quoted 25c off, making the top about \$14.50.

Hogs are still on the decline, \$8 now being the best offered. This is a decline of 75c for the week, as one load of choice hogs sold for \$8.75 Monday. The majority of the sales that day, however, were made at \$8.45. Since then the market has gone off steadily.

"I know this is not an easy task.
