C., Dec. 3. 165 The use of aeroplanes by the war department is recommended by the board of ordnance and fortifications in its annual report to the secretary of war, which has just been submitted. An aero corps and the purchase of a number of aeroplanes is espected to follow the adoption of the report.

The board has been conducting a series of experiments with aeroplanes. Speaking of this kind of war device, the board reported: "It is the opinion of the board that the art of aviation is now developed sufficiently to warrant the purchase by the war department of a number of aeroplanes of existing types and for the training of certain selected officers in the art of flying."


