Refuses to Be Candidate for Mayor or Recorder—Will Ask Admission to Bar as Soon as Legislature Adjourns.

ASHLAND, Or., Dec. 9.—City Recorder Eggleston has been importuned many times to run for mayor. He declines to run either for mayor or city recorder. He will spend 40 days at Salem as representative from Jackson county and after the legislature adjourns will appear before the supreme court and make application for admission to the bar. He intends to open an office in Ashland and practice law. On account of his familiarity with municipal law and the fact that the city will need an attorney after he retires from the recordership, he will give the city council an opportunity to appoint him to that position or do the work of the city in such other manner as the officials may see fit.

Cameron donation land claim, No. 45, in section 3, township 36 south, range 1 west Willamette meridian; thence south 89 degrees 58 minutes west 1514.9 feet along the north line of the said T. Cameron donation land claim to an intersection with the center line of the track of the Pacific and Eastern Railroad Co.; thence south 19 degrees 20 minutes west 2216.5 feet along center line of said railroad track to the P. 1. of the curve south of the said company's depot; thence from said P. 1. of curve south 43 degrees 12 minutes west 1599 feet along center line of said railroad track; thence south 24 degrees 39 minutes east 501.7 feet; thence south 21 degrees 57 minutes east 730.2 feet across Little Butte creek at Fryer's ford; thence north 54 degrees 11 minutes east 4642.5 feet; thence north 1376.8 feet; thence west 971.8 feet to the place of beginning, consisting of all lots, blocks, streets, alleyways and parcels of land within the above described district, and also consisting of all right of way of said Pacific and Eastern Railroad Co. lying adjacent and westward of said center line of said company's track.
