

RAIN CHECKS DEPOT MOVING

Workmen Now Preparing to Leave Structure in Its Present Place Until Such Time as Weather Conditions Become Favorable.

The fact that a part of the old depot was already on wheels and the work of moving it started, and that all of a sudden orders were issued to replace the old building and that new foundation timbers were placed under it, and the building set back in its old position, caused no little comment Saturday afternoon.

That the company has decided not to move the building at the present time is as plain as A, B, C, and inasmuch as the workmen are plumbing, leveling, spiking and nailing the timbers fast, it looks as though the intent is to leave the building where it is at present.

When asked concerning the matter, Mr. Rosenbaum, local agent of the company, said:

"It is merely weather conditions. We cannot tell when the building will be moved; we may know Monday morning and we may not know for two months. It all depends upon the condition of the weather. There has been no trouble with the city, but the weather is so uncertain that no progress can be made."

I. W. W. LEAVING HOSTILE FRESNO

Members of Organization Frightened Into Leaving by Citizens—Camp on Outskirts of Town Has Been Abandoned.

FRESNO, Cal., Dec. 10.—Large numbers of Industrial Workers of the World members, frightened by the open hostility shown them by citizens of Fresno, left town today. The camp, which members of the order have maintained on the outskirts of the city for the past month, was abandoned. Such of the Industrial Workers as chose to remain kept out of sight and a renewal of last night's rioting, which was feared, did not materialize.

The more conservative element of the city gained the upper hand today and it was generally believed that hereafter the police will be able to fully cope with the situation. A half-hearted attempt is being made to detect the ringleaders of the crowd that set fire to the industrial camp, but at noon today no arrests had been made.

BANKS OF OREGON SHOW BIG GAIN

Correct Figures Show Gain in Deposits Since November 10, 1909, of \$14,221,550.63; Capital Now of Banks in State, \$15,162,025.

SALEM, Or., Dec. 10.—State Bank Examiner Will Wright's annual statement, completed yesterday, shows total individual deposits in Oregon banks November 10, 1909, of \$104,270,300.40, a net gain since November 10, 1909, of \$14,221,550.63. The total resources of all Oregon banks on November 10 equaled \$147,518,528.07, a gain for the same period of \$19,829,568.14.

The capital of Oregon banks November 10 was \$15,162,025, a gain for the year or since November 10, 1909, of \$3,046,075. The increase in the number of national banks has been from 77 to 82 during 1910, and an increase in the number of state banks from 155 to 174, making the total number of banks doing business in this state November 10, 256.

Loans and discounts November 10 equaled \$75,886,961.77, a gain for the year of \$13,459,014.99; total amount of cash due from other banks equaled \$42,884,886.46, a gain of \$4,076,826.53. Surplus of profits on hand November 10 equaled \$7,650,861.54, a gain since November 10 a year ago of \$570,195.80.

BIG CAMPAIGN IS TO START IN ARIZONA

PHOENIX, Ariz., Dec. 10.—At a conference held in the capitol today plans for a statewide campaign to insure ratification of the new constitution by the voters were outlined.

It was rumored that the Western Federation of Miners, which organization succeeded in having incorporated in the constitution several clauses of value to organized labor, will finance the campaign.

Borax King Buys Road.

OAKLAND, Cal., Dec. 10.—Frank M. Smith, the "Borax King," today assumed entire possession of the San Francisco, Oakland & San Jose Railway company, otherwise known as the Key Route, having purchased the interest of former partner and friend, Frank C. Havens.

Besides the Key Route property, Smith takes over Havens' interest in the Oakland Realty Syndicate, and the price he paid for the two properties is said to mount high in the millions.

Although the deal has been fore-shadowed for some time, it progressed so quietly that the first intimation the public had of it was when the papers closing it up were filed.

Widely varying theories of what the deal portends are being circulated. Some say that Smith plans tunneling under San Francisco bay. Others believe he proposes deepening the Oakland side of the harbor adjacent to the Key Route holdings.

WILLARD MAKES FLIGHT NEAR ANGEL CITY

LOS ANGELES, Cal., Dec. 10.—Aviator Charles F. Willard today flew from Los Angeles to Pasadena in a Curtiss biplane. He covered the ten miles without mishap, performed several evolutions over the business section and started on the return trip without descending.

Lynch for President.

CHICAGO, Ill., Dec. 10.—Denials and counter-denials are coming

thick and fast in the campaign of President Lynch for re-election as head of the National league. Chas. W. Murphy of Chicago is the latest magnate to brand as false the statement that Lynch will meet with opposition when the National league directors convene to elect officers and the transposition of other annual business. Murphy denied today that he had said he would oppose Lynch's re-election and predicted that Lynch would be the unanimous choice of the directors.

SEATTLE, Wash., Dec. 10.—The sheriff's office is today investigating the brutal attack made upon Mr. and Mrs. Charles Wolf at their ranch in a lonely section of the Cherry valley yesterday. Wolf lay helpless on a sick bed, when a stranger entered the ranch house and attacked the wife. He chloroformed her and then slugged the husband. The bandit then ransacked the house and fled. Neighbors heard of the outrage and notified the sheriff. Deputies in automobiles

are scouring the sparsely settled country hoping to capture the man.

Glover Defense Rests.

CAMBRIDGE, Mass., Dec. 10.—The defense in the trial of Hattie Le Blanc, charged with the murder of Clarence Glover, rested at noon today. The girl, who is accused of having shot and killed Glover, was not called to the stand, although attorneys for the defense had intimated that her testimony would be taken.

The case probably will go to the jury Tuesday or Wednesday. Minor witnesses testified for the defense during the morning. It is expected that the arguments will begin Monday.

CONGRESS MAY REJECT ARIZONA CONSTITUTION

WASHINGTON, D. C., Dec. 10.—Although refusing to comment on the proposed legislation constitution for Arizona until printed copies of the document have been received it can be authoritatively stated that there is a general impression among congressmen that congress will reject the constitution unless the provision for the recall of judges is removed.

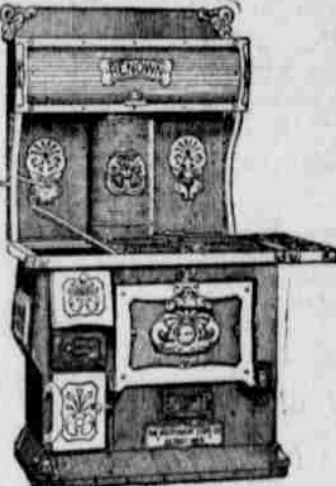
