The Bridal Veil falls have a drop of 250 Waterman, Jefferson Heard, Jon feet.

"In all of my travels through scenic spots in America I have never seen any wonders to surpass those along Crater Lake road." said Mr. Heidel, while in the city yesterday. "The Yosemite valley cannot com pare, in my opinion. Why, eve Medford people do not appreciate the great attractions along the road, and some of them have never seen th beautiful gorge along which the road will pass for six miles. Thick churgof trees hide it at present and comparatively few have penetrated them.

"I ask Mediord people about this gorge, and most of them reply, 'Oh, yes. I have seen it." If I ask them where they saw it, or some other pointed question, they usually discover they have never seen the real gorge and open their eyes in wide wonder when I tell them of some of the scenic values.


