MINISTER GETS 80 YEARS IN JAIL

Fined Also \$4,000,000 for Having Robbed People of Millions During His 14 Years' Career as Banker and Minister of Justice.

COPENHAGEN, Dec. 17.—Former Minister of Justice Alberti today was sentenced to 80 years' imprisonment and a fine of \$4,000,000 for having robbed the people of millions during his 14 years' career as a banker,

broker and minister of justice. The thefts are the largest recorded in the history of Denmark. Thousands of persons were financially involved and hundreds of poor people ruined.

It is believed that Alberti succeeded in hiding several millions and government detectives are endeavoring to trace the stolen money and securities.

12 MILL TAX IN GRANTS PASS

Forty Thousand Dollars to Be Raised for City Purposes—City Auditor to Get Salary of Fifteen Hundred a Year.

GRANTS PASS, Dec. 17.—That Grants Pass has decided to leave that class of cities whose chief boast is their low tax levy is now a fact. With the 12-mill levy ordered last evening by the city council and

the 9-mill levy ordered at the school election, the total city tax will be 21 mills. Besides that, there is the county levy. It means that the work of progress and city building is to go on for the coming season and that Grants Pass will take no backward step.

The salary of the auditor was raised to \$1500 and an office will be fitted up for that official so that he can be found at all times and where city records may be consulted at all times.

The city budget as adopted by the city council calls for a total expenditure of \$40,890. This is to be raised by a levy of a 12-mill tax on all the property within the city.

The budget was adopted unanimously and the ordinance declared that an emergency existed.

The taxable property of the city

amounts to \$2,240,075, according to the tax roll. The charter limit is 3 mills, but it is provided that four additional mills may be levied as a special assessment. This special levy is to be apportioned equally in the drainage and bridge funds.

As submitted by the finance committee the city's funds will be expended as follows: For streets, salary of superintendent, \$900; expenses of team, \$350; salary of teamster, \$340; extra team and driver, \$1200; two extra men, \$1200; lumber, hardware, etc., \$500.

Officers' salaries—Two marshals, \$1800; city attorney, \$1000; auditor, \$1500; treasurer, \$300; surveyor, \$500; special police, \$300; fire department, \$2000; lights, \$3500; parks, \$1800; sewers, \$5000; incidentals, \$2000; bridges and drainage \$10,000; interest on outstanding

warrants, \$4100; interest on bonds, \$1200; total, \$40,890. This leaves an apparent deficit of \$10,890, as the 12-mill levy will raise but \$30,000.

ATLANTA, Ga., Dec. 17.—Reports from Haswell, Ala., were received today that Richard and Alfred Whack, brothers, had been killed in a family fight at Bonfield, near here. Sheriff Rowell left at once for the scene. The dispatches said the fight started over Richard Whack's wife.

WASHINGTON, D. C., Dec. 17.—President Taft ordered a modification of the walking test required of naval officers. The officers are required to walk 25 miles in two days.
