

# GALICE DISTRICT IS SHOWING UP

Although Handicapped by Poor Transportation Facilities, Strides Are Being Made Toward Development—200 Men Employed.

GRANTS PASS, Dec. 20.—Too busy producing and developing to do much talking or to let the world know of its wealth, the Galice mining district is rapidly preparing to become one of the most notable mining sections in the United States.

Handicapped by poor transportation facilities and a long distance to railroads, the district has fought an uphill battle. Yet there has been consistent and constant development and today there are large bodies of proven ore exposed or blocked out, ready for production on a large scale.

The Alameda mine has recently completed a smelter which would have blown in before this time but for the fact that the roads are so poor that it would be impossible or impracticable to operate.

The mine is now expending a large sum building a first-class wagon road to connect with the railroad at Leland. When this is completed operations will be carried on on a large scale.

The Oriole mine is another property on which large sums have been expended in development work. Recently several cars of ore have been shipped to the Tacoma smelter and the returns have been highly gratifying to the owners of the property.

The Old Channel mine is steadily producing. This is one of the best known properties in the district. A large force of men is employed at the mine at this time.

Another property which is yielding results is the Wedge mine. Extensive improvements have been recently effected about this property and a large force of men is kept at work constantly.

The Black Bear and the Galice Consolidated are working with satisfactory results to all concerned. Many other properties are in course of development and the next few years will add much to the production of this district.

Not only are the quartz mines getting results, but the Rogne River Dredging company is getting gold from the sands of Rogne river. A crew of seven men is engaged upon this work. All told, there are approximately 200 men employed in mining in this district alone. While the world now hears a great deal of Rogne River valley fruits, in a few years Josephine county will be as famous for its rich mines as the Galice and other mining districts as it is now for other products.

# WILL HUNT GAME IN AN AEROPLANE

Sportsmen of California, However, Protest Stunt to Be Pulled Off During Aviation Meet in California.

SAN FRANCISCO, Cal., Dec. 20.—Frank Dolliver, one of the most widely known sportsmen in California, has written a letter to the board of fish and game commissioners voicing the protest of sportsmen against the hunt to be undertaken with an aeroplane by Lieutenant Paul Beck, detailed by the government to supervise military experiments during the aviation meet next January.

These officials propose to shoot the game in the course of a daredevil fight to be made in the Sacramento valley on a date to be chosen on New Year's day and the opening of the Tamoran meet. Scottford will take his gun on board a Wright machine driven by Roy Knabenshue and Lieutenant Beck will try to bag his game from a Curtiss aeroplane driven by R. R. Young.

Originally started as a "sporting proposition" by Scottford, who thought he was aviating too high for the daring birdmen to follow, it was promptly brought to earth by Knabenshue and Young, who immediately agreed to make the flight "if Scottford has the nerve."

The terms in which the acceptance was couched deprived Scottford of the nerve to refuse, and the date of the flight to take place in the Sacramento valley will be announced within the next few days, as soon as the details of the course, landing and starting points, etc., have been decided upon.

Dolliver claims that to permit such a hunt to establish a very dangerous precedent, in view of the rapid improvement of the aeroplane and that such a hunt can easily be construed as a violation, in letter as well as in principle, of section 626 of the penal code, prohibiting the hunting of game birds from motor boats.

An aeroplane, he points out, is commonly described as a boat of ship of the air. It is propelled through a fluid medium by a motor and with the speed and ease of control that have been developed in its recent trials the flying machine, he asserts, can easily become the most devastating weapon available to persons of the "game hog" type.

C. C. Chapman, manager of the Portland Commercial club, held a conference with Mr. Shank this morning and declared himself heartily in favor of Oregon making a creditable display.

"This organization would have taken the matter up and collected the exhibit but for the fact that it is out of our line of work and the different communities will make the display in better fashion than would be possible from here," said Mr. Chapman. "The exhibits are fine things and this organization will co-operate in every way to get the best results. The showing to be made will reach the farmer rather than the city dweller, a most desirable consideration."
