

TO PROTECT THE BREAD BASKET

New York's Delegation Will Go to Congress March 4 With Determination to Land on the High Cost of Living.

NEW YORK, Dec. 20.—The first solid congressional delegation which New York will send to the house of representatives in many years on March 4th next, is furnishing its armor for the most bitter campaign upon which the democratic host of o'Gham has ever embarked in the national capital.

Led by Henry George, Jr., regarded by the democracy of New York as one of the country's greatest political economists, the delegation is to champion the American bread basket.

It is going after the scalp of United States Senator Nelson W. Aldrich of Rhode Island, chief sponsor for the Payne-Aldrich tariff and all that he stood for and represented as chairman of the senate finance committee. In the furtherance of that policy it is to single out for assault the principal measures fostered by the Rhode Island solon in the alleged interests of the rubber trust and the other monopolies subserved by the tariff he drafted.

With the price of the necessities of every day life from 10 to 30 per cent higher here than anywhere else, New York has felt the pinch of the increased cost of living more than any other American city. For this it holds Aldrich largely responsible. Hence the disposition to concentrate fire on him and all his works.

In spite of his frequently emphasized denials before election, recent revelations have established the fact that Senator Aldrich holds more than \$3,000,000 worth of stock in the International Rubber company, the \$10,000,000 rubber trust. The jugglery of the schedule on manufactured rubber imposed a heavy tax on the apple of the poor lady's milk bottle as well as on the tires of the rich man's automobile. Poor babies are more numerous in New York than elsewhere, so that the tribute extorted from them for the benefit of the trust, has added a burden, individually small though it be, to a class that can least afford it. Unmanufactured plantation rubber, of the best grades, commanding here \$1.50 a pound can be collected and delivered in New York from the East Indies or from British Guiana, which is now coming into the market, at a cost of 25 cents a pound and wild rubber from Brazil for 75 cents, showing a profit anywhere from 100 to 500 per cent. In adjusting the Payne-Aldrich tariff schedule, so that those who are interested in its use for manufacturing purposes may exact still further profits, Aldrich and his associate, in the opinion of New York's congressional delegation displayed an inordinate sense of greed, which is deserving of rebuke.

JEW'S ALLOWED NOW IN MOSCOW

For First Time in Centuries Members of Jewish Faith May Establish Legal Residence in the City of Moscow, Russia.

ST. PETERSBURG, Dec. 20.—An imperial order has been published confirming a resolution recently adopted by the cabinet permitting Jewish merchants of the first guild to reside in the city and province of Moscow.

Emperor Nicholas approved the opening up of new sections for the residence of Jews on November 1. Heretofore legal residence of Jews had been restricted to that section of the Polish provinces and the Ukraine delimited by the original Jewish segregation law and known as "the pale."

The new sections embrace 12 districts in the provinces of Vilebsk, Volhynia, Mohilov, Poltava and Khezon, and the town of Yakaterinodar. The action of the government resulted from petitions of the inhabitants of the newly opened localities, who desired the admission of Jewish residents as a means of improving local business conditions.

An official list was published in May, which includes less than 200 Jewish merchants of the first guild whose families were legally entitled to live in Moscow. According to the estimates at the time, several hundred others came within the order of expulsion.
