LUNATICS PROVE BEST SHOPPERS

Test Shows That the Insane Patients Bought Real Bargains, According to Superintendent of Asylum in St.

ST. LOUIS, Dec. 26.—Superintendent J. Atkins of the City Hospital for theinsane, believes that insane persons showed more judgment than most shoppers in making their Chrisamas purchases. He conducted an interesting series of experiments by permitting 10 of his patients each day to mingle with shoppers in big department stores.

"The women bring their purchases to me for inspection," he said yesterday, "and I find that in almost every case they have bought real bargains."

Each group of patients was escarted through the down town district by an attendant. The attendant does not wear the garb of a nurse, and there is nothing about her charges to indicate whence they come. Dr. Atkinson says that the shopping parties have had a salutary effect on those who have been permitted to indulge in them.

"Normal shoppers do not know they are rubbing elbows with the insone, and since the experiments began a week ago, there has not been a case in which a patient did anything to attract attention to her mental infirmity.
