

# MISS CRAMER TO FLY WITH ELY

Will Be Passenger With Aviator at San Francisco—Has Been Invited to Fly to San Rafael and Back Again.

SAN FRANCISCO, Dec. 26.—Mabel Cramer, famous California beauty, winner of prizes for pulchritude, and intimate of Mrs. Mabel Ely, who is the wife of Eugene Ely, the Curtiss star birdman, is the latest to announce her intention to fly at the Tanforan meet. She has been invited by Ely to make the flight to San Rafael and back from Aviation park and try for the \$5000 prize offered by the Marin County Promotion league for the aviator who will make the return trip with a passenger.

As at least three other aviators will participate in the race, the San Francisco society girls who have expressed their ambition of flying will have an opportunity of being among the first three to make a long distance flight over water as aeroplane passengers.

The distance from Tanforan Aviation park to San Rafael is 24 miles and the successful completion of the return journey will establish a record, for the famous English channel trip of Bleriot was just a trifle over 22 miles. The superior qualities of the biplane as regards stability and reliability in the face of sudden gusts and air currents is counted upon to make the journey by the improved machines, such as are to be shown at the Tanforan meet, much more safe and certain than the monoplane trip across the channel by Bleriot or Latham.

Latham, who fell into the English channel while attempting the trip from Calais to Dover will be a competitor at the Tanforan meet, but will be barred from the San Rafael race because it will be impossible for him to carry a passenger on the tiny Antoinette monoplane which he drives.

# \$225,000,000 IN NEW DIVIDENDS

Disbursements at Opening of 1911 to Be Record Breaker—Stock Market Quiet During the Week Preceding Holidays

NEW YORK, Dec. 26.—Business was unusually dull in Wall street, during the week. The swing of the market has not been more than two points during the last two weeks and limited to a very narrow scope. The sessions of Tuesday and Wednesday were moderately active. This, to some extent, relieved the dullness of the week and brought the average daily changes up to 265,000 shares.

Natural to this season of the year was better investment for securities especially for bonds. An enormous amount of dividend money will be re-leased on January 1. It is estimated that as high as \$225,000,000 against \$200,000,000 a year ago. Two years ago January disbursements did not exceed \$100,000,000 and the total payments on stocks and bonds then were \$730,000,000. On the earnings of 1910 they will be nearly \$1,500,000.

This includes an enormous amount of new interest bearing bonds. At the same time no small part of it is the product of capital that was earning nothing in the earlier bonds. At the same time no small part of it is the product of capital that was earning nothing in the earlier years and now is highly productive. A case in point is that of the Lehigh Valley railroad whose dividends were suspended in 1900 and which have just been placed on a 10 per cent basis.

The bank statement for the week fulfilled the favorable expectations of yesterday, although the actual week-end statements showed barely half as large gain in cash as had been expected. The \$2,900,000 addition to that account, however, more than offset a \$6,200,000 loan expansion and the resultant increase in deposits increased half a million.

The actual surplus reserve is now slightly below that of this week in 1909 and is also less than in 1907 or 1904. With other recent years it was a favorable comparison. Among other changes of the week the excess of loans over deposits is cut down \$300,000. That excess is now \$34,800. It was \$38,900,000, a fortnight ago, and \$19,100,000 at this time last year. In the closing week of 1909 the loan excess rose to \$25,100,000, but disappeared altogether two weeks later. The wide fluctuations of the week in foreign exchange makes the direct attention to what usually follows in January after the year ends.

The gold movement between the United States and Europe for the month has been sufficiently irregular to give interest of the probable course of exchange during the next five weeks.

Business in Wall street is looking of the new year for a revival along all industrial lines. The merchants have enjoyed an unusually large Christmas trade and the removal of spring orders by the jobbers calls for renewed activity among the manufacturers of all staple products. The farming interests of the country.

The feature of the general trade situation is the manner in which the railroad gross earnings continue to increase.
