

**WHY WESTERN APPLES COMPETE WITH EASTERN**

Here is an editorial taken from the Joliet, Ill., Daily News of December 13, that may be read with interest and profit by our Oregon fruitgrowers:

"Northwestern apples can compete with eastern apples in the New-York market. Why? They do and there may be reasons why. But there is one reason that seems to us enough. Growing apples in the east is a side-line business with the orchardists or farmers. Evidently the apples grow themselves.

"We bought a barrel of New York Baldwins, paying a price that ought to make apple-growing a bonanza in New York state. Opening the barrel there was revealed as large and well-colored apples as any one could desire. Leaving the open barrel undisturbed, the members of our family commented on the size and beauty of the apples when they saw them for the first time. But when the first two rows of apples were removed there was revealed what must be called the run of the crop, apples that an apple grower would not think of packing. This is enough, but only half the reason. When the selected apples packed on top were examined, there was not one that was free of insect marks and when pared each one disclosed bruises as the result of careless harvesting and packing.

"If eastern apple growers would take half the pains and spend half the money and labor in growing apples that the northwestern man takes, spray the trees, cultivate his orchards, cull his fruit, hand pick, and pack in boxes, he would find apple growing just as profitable to him as it is to the northwestern man."
