MEXICAN REVOLUTIONISTS CAPTURED IN BATTLE

GALVESTON, Tex., Dec. 30.—That Malpasco, a stronghold of the revolutionists, has been captured in a battle in which 14 federal soldiers were killed, is confirmed in private dispatches received here today from Chihuahua.

The report that Colonel Gazan was killed also is confirmed with the federal soldiers who stormed Malpasco, were led by General Escurado. A number of the rebels were wounded, but most of the injured were taken with the flying soldiers. The revolutionists' force retreated to the mountains, where it is reported the federals are pursuing them.

MRS. SUSAN VEACH DIED LAST NIGHT

The funeral of Mrs. Susan Veach, who died at her home at an early hour this morning from the effects of an abscess on her lungs, will be held at 2 o'clock Saturday afternoon at the chapel of the Medford Undertaking company.

Mrs. Veach has been a resident of Medford for 13 years and is survived by a daughter, Mrs. Myrtle Ridenour, and five sons—David, Clarence H., Vernon, Harold and Frank Veach.

BOYS IN AUTO WILL RACE PAPER TRAIN

SACRAMENTO, Cal., Dec. 30.—Ralph and C. J. Skinner have planned to race the Southern Pacific night newspaper train from San Francisco to Sacramento in their cylinder Mitchell racing automobile within the next few days. The Skinner brothers at the time of the Jeffries-Johnson fight carried a San Francisco daily paper to Reno by automobile in nearly two hours' less time than it took the Overland mail to make the run.

They are confident that they can cover the distance from the bay by way of Stockton to Sacramento, approximately 140 miles, in about two hours and fifty minutes. This is 47 minutes less than it takes the newspaper train to make the run. The train leaves Oakland at 2:15 a. m.

PAVING BONDS APPROVED; PAID

First National Bank of Cleveland Approves Last Issue of 1910 Street Paving Bonds—Money Is Paid Contractors.

Advice to the effect that the First National Bank of Cleveland, O., had approved the last issue of city paving bonds for the year 1910 and that the \$21,000 called for in them had been paid over to the contracting firm of Clark & Henery, was received by City Recorder R. W. Telfer this morning.

All of the paving contracted for under the bond issue, amounting to approximately six miles, is completed and has been accepted by the city, and of the sum required to float the issue, only about \$6000 is now delinquent. The entire bond issue called for almost \$200,000.

During the coming year it is expected that about an equal amount of paving work will be done in the city.

TO EXTEND POWER OF COMMISSION

Washington May Place Steamboats. Power Houses, Electric Lines and Lighting Plants Under Jurisdiction of State Railroad Board.

OLMPIA, Wash., Dec. 30.—A bill is being prepared by the state railroad commission for presentation before the legislature at its coming session, that if passed will place under the jurisdiction of the commission all the steamboats, street-cars, gas, electric light, water and power plants operating in Washington. This means that passes and franks will come to be things of the past in the state as a provision in the railroad commission act prohibits the issuance of any passes or franks to any but employees of corporations under the commission's jurisdiction.
