ORDINANCE NO. 130.
An ordinance providing for the construction of a 6-inch lateral sewer along Fir street from Second street north to a point 50 feet from Jackson street, and for the assessment of the cost thereof on the property directly benefited thereby and adjacent thereto, and providing a meeting of the council to consider protests against said construction and assessment and the serving of the owners of such property with notice thereof.

The city of Medford doth ordain as follows:
Section 1. It is the intention of the council to cause a 6-inch lateral sewer to be constructed along Fir street from Second street north to a point 50 feet from Jackson street, and to assess the cost thereof upon the property directly benefited thereby and adjacent thereto.

Section 2. The council will hear and consider any protests against said construction and the assessing of said property for the cost thereof, at a meeting of the council to be held January 17th, 1911, at 7:30 o'clock p. m., in the council chambers of said city, and all property owners of property adjacent to said sewer and benefited thereby are hereby called upon to appear before said council at said time and place, and show cause, if any they have, why said construction should not be made and the cost thereof so assessed.

Section 3. The city recorder is hereby directed to serve notice thereof upon the property owners aforesaid, by causing three copies of this ordinance to be posted in three public places in said city, and said ordinance to be published once in a daily newspaper published and of general circulation in said city, at least 10 days before the date of said meeting.

RESOLUTION.

Be it resolved by the city council of the city of Medford, Oregon:

That it is the intention of the council to lay a 4-inch water main on Fir street from Second street to Jackson street, and to assess the cost thereof upon the property fronting on said portion of said street in proportion to the frontage of said property.

The council will meet at the council chamber in the city hall in said city on the 17th day of January, 1911, at 7:30 p. m. at which time all protests against the laying of said water main on said portion of said street and the assessment of the cost thereof upon the property fronting thereon will be heard.

ORDINANCE NO. 129.

An ordinance declaring the assessment on the property benefited for the cost of laying a 4-inch water main on North Orange street from West Main street to West Fourth street, and directing the recorder to enter a statement thereof in the water main lien docket.

The City of Medford doth ordain as follows:
Section 1. Whereas, the city council did heretofore, by resolution declare its intention to lay a 4-inch water main on North Orange street from West Main street to West Fourth street and to assess the cost thereof on the property fronting on said portion of said street in proportion to the frontage of said property, and fix a time and place for hearing protests against the laying of said water main on said part of said street and the assessment of the cost thereof as aforesaid.

And, whereas, said resolution was duly published and posted as required by section 116 of the charter of said city:

And, whereas, a meeting of the council was held at the time and place fixed in said resolution, for the purpose of considering any such protests, but no protests were at said time, or at any other time made to or received by the council to the said laying of said water main or the assessment of the cost as aforesaid, and said council having considered the matter, and deeming that said water main was and is of material benefit to said city, and that all property to be assessed therefor would be benefited thereby to the extent of the probable amount of said respective assessments to be levied against said property did order said main laid.

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ate share of the cost of laying said water main of each parcel of property fronting on said portion of said street is the amount set opposite the description of each parcel of land below, and that each piece or parcel of land benefited by the laying of the said main to the full extent of the amount so set opposite the description of the same, and that the respective amounts represent the proportional benefits of said water main to said respective parcels of land, and also the proportional frontage thereof on said street, and the council does hereby declare each of the parcels of property described below to be assessed and each of the same is hereby assessed the amount set opposite each description for the cost of laying said water main.
