## NEGOTIATIONS WITH CANADA TO RE-OPEN

OTTAWA, Ont., Jan. 6.—When Ministers Fielding and Paterson resume at Washington on Saturday the reciprocity negotiations carried on here last November they will deal directly with Mr. Knox, American secretary of state, and when necessary, with President Taft.

In the last conference the United States was represented by the late Henry M. Hoyt, counsellor of the state department, and Charles M. Pepper, trade advisor. While eminent authorities, these gentlemen were junior in rank to the Canadian cabinet ministers to whom the dominion case was entrusted.

The dominion government did not feel that this indicated any lack of appreciation by the American government of the importance of the negotiations, but was rather the result of the Canadian system of negotiating in which cabinet ministers charged with parliamentary responsibility for negotiations prefer by the personal conduct of exchanges to familiarize themselves with all details.

### COOS COUNTY WILL BE WET FOR TWO YEARS

BANDON, Ore., Jan. 6.—Shortly after the November election, at which Coos county voted "dry" by 17 majority, the liquor interests secured an injunction from Judge Coke of the circuit court enjoining County Judge Hall from declaring the county "dry" as shown on the face of the election returns. The allegation set forth by the saloonmen was that not enough qualified electors had signed the local option petition by virtue of which the liquor election was held. The circuit judge has now sustained the injunction and Coos county will continue to have saloons for two years more. No recourse was taken under the provisions of the home rule law, and no special election will be held either in Bandon, Coquille, North Bend or Marshfield.
