SPOKANE, Wash., Jan. 10.—J. L. Dumas, formerly president of the Washington State Horticultural association, has gone to Tampa, Fla., to attend the meeting of the American Pomological society with a view to securing a higher commercial rating for standard apples grown in the Pacific and Northwestern states.

"I believe that the Winesap, the McIntosh Red and the Rome Beauty are entitled to one point more than they are given at present," Mr. Dumas said.

While in the east Mr. Dumas will attend the meetings of the Missouri state board of horticulture, the Arkansas State Horticultural society and the West Virginia Horticultural society.
