Before an audience which fully made up in appreciation all that it lacked in numbers, Miss Grace Cameron last night appeared in child-character role of Nancy in the play of that name.

A portrayal of the life of a supposedly orphaned child who, in the home of a farmer into which she was adopted at an early age, is made to suffer for the peculations of the farmer's own daughter, the role gave Miss Cameron plenty of opportunity to display to advantage her ability as a character actress, and in addition furnished her plenty of chances to show off the versatility of Miss Cameron, is not one that leaves a very deep impression, being merely a sort of up to date "Cinderella" idea, with a cast of characters who, with the exception of Nancy and her adopted father, represent everything undesirable from a country girl turned to burlesque queen and thief to a fleece-em-alive chromo shark.

PORTLAND, Jan. 19.—Word received from San Francisco that the dining car service of the Southern Pacific is considering inauguration of a table d'hote service on the Shasta Limited, the crack train of the Southern Pacific coast service. It is figured that by serving meal at \$1 a plate it will enhance the popularity of the Limited. The idea of abolishing the present a la carte service came after suggestions had been asked from a large number of patrons of the train. The majority of replies were that a dollar a plate table d'hote meal would be more desirable.

Should the change be made it will mark an innovation in this part of the country, though a number of years ago some of the through transcontinental routes tried the plan but abandoned it.

HUSBAND'S MURDER MAY BE DUE TO JEALOUSY

LONG BEACH, Cal., Jan. 19.—John Bowers, aged 43, a Los Angeles photograph postal card man, was shot and killed on his own doorstep at 1372 East Ocean avenue, early today by Richard Ward, 23, an employe of Bowers, who lived with the latter and his wife.

Ward says Bowers wore a muffler about his face and he thought him a burglar. Ward and Mrs. Bowers assert that Bowers left home yesterday morning presumably to be gone three days and that his return at 2:30 this morning was due to jealousy and a desire to spy on his wife.

IROQUOIS MEMORIAL HOSPITAL NEARLY BURNED

CHICAGO, Jan. 19.—The Iroquois Memorial Emergency hospital, erected as a memorial to the 600 people who lost their lives in the Iroquois theatre fire seven years ago, narrowly escaped destruction by fire yesterday just before it was formally opened for patients. Fire was discovered in a pile of excelsior in the rear of the place and for a time it was feared that serious damage might result. A fire alarm was given, but before the firemen arrived, spectators, led by Dr. Matthew Karasak, in charge of the hospital and extinguished the blaze. It is thought that the fire was caused by a lighted cigar which was thrown into a pile of excelsior.
