NEW YOPK, Jan. 20. - Andraw Carnegie has found a "hymn of in ternational peace." It was written by Prof. George Huntington, librarian in Carleton college, Northfield Minn., until he was retired in 1906 oa a pension granted by the Carnegie foundation for the advancement of teaching.

The hymn, which is in the meter of "America" and "God Save the King," has pleased Mr. Carnegie so much that he has distributed 100 copies among his friends and he has sent 1500 copies to members of peace societies throughout the Uniced States.
